AFN plans to restore delayed programming

American Forces Network-Lajes will attempt to restore delayed TV programming on Channel 8/37, also called AFN Atlantic, based on April poll results.

According to Senior Master Sgt. Jesse Hall, AFN-Lajes detachment chief, 54 percent of respondents favored the two-hour delay.

"The amount of people who weighed in was tremendous — nearly 500," Hall said. "This gave us enough numbers and diversity to get a decent picture of what folks were thinking. And based on the feedback, a majority want the two-hour delay."

Hall said AFN's plan is to retrieve its virtual recorder from repairs in the United States, re-install it, then run tests for two to three weeks.

If it works flawlessly, Hall said they'll switch to delayed programming during the week, but return to live broadcast during weekends to accommodate early sports viewing.

"Three percent of those favoring delayed programming voiced their pref-

erence for live sports," Hall said, adding, "It's a safe bet that many more viewers share that preference. In the past, we've received a lot of support for this, particularly during football season."

The detachment chief said 44 percent of respondents were in favor of retaining live broadcast, while an additional 2 percent had no preference.

For several years, AFN-Lajes has recorded Atlantic's live programming and broadcast it with a two-hour delay.

This allowed local viewers to watch their favorite programs at roughly the

same time they would see them in the United States.

However, due to equipment challenges, Atlantic programming has been airing live for the last few months.

This means primetime programs are airing two hours earlier than they normally would in the States.

The *Crossroads* TV guide should be able to reflect the accurate schedule in future issues.

Fire burns career

Senior Airman Jeffrey Beagle has been sentenced to five years confinement, reduction to airman basic, total forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and a dishonorable discharge for destroying a \$1.77 million vehicle maintenance building at Osan AB, Korea, March 16.

Beagle was also convicted and sentenced for fraudulently writing more than \$5,000 worth of bad checks to the base exchange and for being absent without leave for two days immediately after the March fire. He has been held in pretrial confinement since authorities apprehended him two days after the arson.



Beagle, from the 554th Red Horse Squadron, pleaded guilty to the bad check and the AWOL offenses. He also pleaded guilty to attempted arson, but not guilty to the arson itself. Beagle said he was trying to commit suicide by burning down the building.

He admitted spreading flammable accelerant on both levels of the building with the intent to destroy it. He also said he doused himself. Beagle also used highly flammable acetylene bottles to help carry out his plan. He placed a note on the door to the facility, which read, "All I can think about are bad things. I don't want to live this way anymore. The Evil will burn in hell for all eternity."

He said he smoked a cigarette to build up the courage to ignite the building and claimed he accidentally dropped the cigarette, which caused the fire to ignite.

The judge found him guilty of attempted arson, but not guilty of the arson itself.

NCO steals allowances

Two airmen have been convicted of various financial crimes during separate general courts-martial at Osan AB, Korea.

Master Sgt. Clarence Lott pleaded guilty to, and was convicted of, submitting a false official document, larceny of housing allowances in excess of \$500 and obstruction of justice. The sergeant, from the 51st Maintenance Group, had 19 years and 9 months of service at the time of trial.

Lott submitted a false housing-allowance form to finance officials in which he claimed his dependents resided in San Francisco, when in fact they lived in Arizona. Prosecutors showed he stole about \$19,000 in excess allowances by misrepresenting the location of his dependents.

Quality-of-life surveys in

THE PENTAGON — The results of the 2002 Chief of Staff Quality-of-Life Survey have been compiled and show an increase in satisfaction with the Air Force as a job and way of life, survey officials said.

The survey, sent to more than 100,000 active-duty airmen and civilian employees in September, included questions about the job, career intent and quality-of-life priorities such as manpower, work environment and compensation.


Charles Hamilton, chief of the Air Force Personnel Center's survey branch at Randolph Air Force Base, Texas, said the 2002 survey shows increased satisfaction, virtually across the board.

Overall, 90 percent of airmen, including pilots, and 89 percent of civilians believe the Air Force is a good place to work and 81 percent of military and 91 percent of civilians report that their families are supportive of their careers, Rivers said.

The survey also showed that career intent increased among all groups from previous years, she said. Nearly 75 percent of all officers, 66 percent of the enlisted force and 82 percent of civilians report they will make the Air Force a career.

However, a common quality-of-life concern among all groups surveyed was manpower.

Nonpilot officers and civilians ranked manpower as their main concern while



is tempo, and benefit their top two concerns.

More than 50 percent of commanders and first sergeants who took the survey also reported manpower as their top quality-of-life concern, Rivers said.

Survey results indicate officers spend 7.9 hours per week, and enlisted members 8.3 hours per week, on additional duties. Civilians reported spending 3.3 hours per week on additional duties.

Although the 2002 survey showed between an 11 percent and 46 percent decrease among the various demographic groups in the number of people who believed the military retirement system was unfair, it also highlighted another worry for personnel officials.


Nearly 70 percent of company grade pilots, 49 percent of company grade nonpilots, 89 percent of first-term airmen and 60 percent of second-term airmen reported they do not know which retirement system applies to them.

After realizing his larceny was about to be discovered, he obstructed justice by contacting a senior airman he had previously supervised and asking the airman to provide false information to investigators.

He asked the airman to provide a false address to mislead investigators. Instead, the airman reported him to authorities.

He was convicted of all three crimes and sentenced to a bad-conduct discharge and reduction to senior airman. A bad-conduct discharge punitively removes the offender from the Air Force without any retirement benefits or pay.

Airman 1st Class Francisco Lira, 51st Communications Squadron, pleaded guilty



to writing about \$7,200 worth of bad checks and misusing his government-travel card.

Lira wrote 59 worthless checks. The Air Force has been recovering the bad check money by involuntary allotments of his military pay. The airman also repeatedly used his government travel card for unofficial, personal purposes and then did not pay the \$4,200 debt.

The judge found the airman guilty of the all charges and sentenced him to reduction to airman basic, confinement for four months and a bad-conduct discharge.

Former NCO shares experience

RAMSTEIN AB, Germany — My story isn't about how I urinated all over myself while performing a field sobriety test, or how I struggled with the female security forces member who put me in cuffs after I was apprehended for driving under the influence.

My story is about the realization and acceptance of the mistake I made, and the effect it's had on me and the people around me.

The realization of what I did began to sink in during my verbal reprimand from the wing vice commander about my recent behavior.

As I stood at attention in front of him, he looked up from his desk after reading my charges and asked one simple question, "Why?"

No matter how hard I thought about it, all I could think of was the usual, "I made a bad decision... I had a lapse of judgment."

He sat behind his seemingly larger than normal desk, in a room in which I felt so small, and said, "No. That's not good enough. Why?"

As I looked slightly above his frightfully piercing-blue eyes, I stood there trembling, trying to muster a more acceptable answer.

No matter how hard I tried to use my gift for saying what people wanted to hear, I couldn't form a complete thought. It was like every word in my vocabulary had instantly vanished.

My need to drink, and lack of control over it, clouded the thoughts of whom I'd disappoint or possibly even hurt.

At that moment, his question seemed to be the most profound thing I had ever heard. I thought, "Why? What does he mean, why? How do I answer this?"

Because I couldn't answer his question, and was completely baffled by it, I sought help. It's because of the help I received that I can say this: I didn't care about anyone else — it was all about me. My need to drink, and lack of control over it, clouded the thoughts of whom I'd disappoint or possibly even hurt.

I too, was one who rolled my eyes at the ever-popular saying, "If you drink, don't drive. If you drive, don't drink. If you're drunk and you need a ride, call someone."

Personally, I couldn't really picture my supervisor being too thrilled about rolling out of bed at 3 a.m. on a weekday to come pick me up at a bar. I could just see the look on his face, and hear the tone in his voice during the stern lecture I'd surely receive.

Flashbacks of busting curfew in high school entered my head, and out

of sheer fear of reliving those torturous speeches, I thought to myself, "I'm fine. I'm a good driver. I can do this."

Looks like I was wrong. A quick read of the police report will tell you just how wrong I was.

But, I shouldn't have been afraid. Because right now, I'd take a good, late-night verbal assault over everything I've put the people who care

Question: Can a U.S. citizen, military or civilian, buy land or a house or build a house on any of the islands?

Any foreign citizen, American or any other nationality, can buy land, a house or even build a house on any of the islands or any other part of the Portuguese territory, provided they have legalized their stay in the country through the Portuguese equivalent of immigration and naturalization services. For example, an individual who comes to the Azores as a military member and decides to retire and live here would have to apply for an authorization that

Walk of shame

When people think about losing a stripe, they usually worry about losing money or having to start promotion dates all over again. But wait, there's more. There are the little things that get overlooked until you're forced to face them.

For me, that walk of shame has included:

- Changing my e-mail signature block.
- Answering the phone at work.
- Getting all new uniforms so the unfaded spot the larger stripes once covered doesn't show.
- Knowing the entire community here and Air Force Public Affairs career field will see my name has changed in the base paper and in stories on the Web. See it and simply wonder.
- Bumping into old classmates or co-workers and getting puzzled looks.
- Getting a new ID card and new checks printed.
- Having to pay out of my own pocket to move into the dorm, while

finding a place to store my extra belongings that won't fit in the room.

■ Finding transportation to and from work, meetings, appointments, the commissary, all the while knowing I have a beautiful brand new car I can't drive.

■ Breaking the news to my parents who are retired military and hearing they've shared the news with other retired military family members.

■ Explaining to my little sister, the little girl who used to idolize me, how I shamed myself and my unit.

Unfortunately, the list doesn't stop here. Every day, I'm presented with a new obstacle or embarrassing moment that I never imagined I would ever have to deal with.

Yet still, I consider myself very lucky. Not only could my punishment have been a lot worse, I could have hurt or even killed someone.

Now, I have a second chance. Because of great support from friends and co-workers, and the help I've received, I can get through this. Not only can I get through it, I can prove to others, and to myself, that I am indeed a valuable member of the Air Force team.

But, I can't do it alone. No one can. My advice to those who read this:

always have a plan and stick to it. However, if your plan fails, pick up the phone and ask for help, whatever your problem may be.

Don't stop if you can't reach someone right away, keep dialing until someone picks up — someone always picks up.

Buying property in Azores

would allow him to permanently live here.

However, foreign citizens must follow all legal procedures with several Portuguese government departments. This ensures the house or land they are buying is legally registered.

After the buyer reaches an agreement with the landowner or the owner of the house concerning the property's price, he or she needs to make an appointment at the notary's office for the deed. Once the deed is finished, the buyer also needs to register the property, land or house, in the *Conservatória do Registo Predial*, property's register office.

In addition, the buyer also needs to

contact the Portuguese equivalent of Internal Revenue Service (*Repartição de Finanças*) to register the property in that department. Any foreign citizen who owns property in Portugal will then be subject to pay taxes.

If one intends to build a house on land that is already legally owned, the first step is to contact the city hall of the respective district where the lands sits. This is so the buyer can get the required approval for the construction. This is a lengthy process that can

take several months in some cases, depending on the location of the land and the city hall resources.
