Myers, Pace, second terms

President Bush has nominated Air Force Gen. Richard Myers for a second two-year term as chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and Marine Corps Gen. Peter Pace to continue to serve as vice chairman.

Both men have served in their positions since Oct. 1, 2001. The Senate must confirm both men.

Myers was the vice chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff prior to becoming chairman.

In addition to renominating Myers and Pace, President Bush has nominated retired Gen. Peter J. Schoomaker to be the next Army chief of staff. Gen. John P. Jumper, the Air Force chief of staff, will finish two

years of duty in September.

Adm. Vern Clark is already in his second term as chief of naval operations. He assumed his duties July 21, 2000.

New BDU uniform?

Air Force officials are considering an Air Force-distinctive uniform to replace the current battle dress uniform, according to service officials.

A fit and wear test is pending to determine the best direction to respond to Air Force needs for a 21st century utility uniform.

Many new Air Force uniforms and uniform items are fit or wear tested in the field before becoming available.

This wear test usually lasts six months to one year

but can be extended based upon the complexity of the uniform and feedback from the wear testers. Force leaders will review the feedback and a decision will be made whether to implement the uniform.

Involuntary retraining

More than 900 airmen may be involuntarily moved to shortage career skills starting July 7, according to Air Force Personnel Center officials.

Although 450 airmen volunteered to change career fields during the initial phase of this year's noncommissioned officer retraining program, it was not enough.

Around the second week of July, officials will begin notifying airmen selected as most vulnerable to retrain. Officials will ask them to submit choices of shortage career fields retrainees would most like to

retrain into as part of the program's Phase II. The second phase runs through Aug. 15.

Under Phase II, not everyone is guaranteed his or her first choice. Major commands continue to accept volunteer applications. Personnel officials encourage all eligible NCOs to also consider special-duty assignments such as recruiting, military training instructors, first sergeant duty or professional military education instructor.

The Air Force said it needed about 1,400 airmen to change careers.

Factors such as retention rates and new promotions have an effect on how many airmen will finally be retrained and where they will be needed.

We hear the word American and the first things that come to mind for me are the "Stars and Bars," the bald eagle, or even the Statue of Liberty. These are all signs of our great nation, and most of us can relate to these images. But what does it mean to be an American? With the 4th of July holiday coming up, I struggled with this recently.

Three times a year, Memorial Day, Veteran's Day and Fourth of July, we reflect on the sacrifices of the men and women who have gone before us. On these days, Americans come together to honor those who have done so much for our nation and who have united Americans through hardships.

Sept. 11, 2001, should also have close to the same significance. With the unbearable grief it brought, a sense of unity began to emerge too.

Flags warn swimmers dangers, so ... **Look before you leap**

What is the meaning of the different colored flags flying at the beaches and swimming areas around the island?

The different colored flags displayed at the beaches and swimming areas around the island indicate the swimming or wading conditions in those areas, namely a variety of hazards including strong waves or the presence of jellyfish in the water.

Green flags mean ocean conditions are favorable for wading and swimming and it's okay to do so. A yellow

flag means that it's dangerous to swim, but it's still okay to wade, and the red flag means it's dangerous to wade or swim. A checkered flag indicates that, temporarily, there are no lifeguards. During exceptional and emergency situations a checkered flag may also fly in conjunction with other flags. This indicates that you may swim at your own risk, but is not advisable.

In addition, some areas like Praia beach only have watchmen, who are not necessarily qualified as lifeguards. Some of them are hired only to watch over beach activities and to make sure users comply with stipulated rules.

Places to swim

■ **Praia Beach** is the only sandy strip on the island — about five minutes from base.

■ **Porto Martins** offers a natural swimming hole with a small sandy area that can be used by children. A separate sunbathing area includes a ladder into the open ocean water and a diving board. It's about 15 minutes southeast of Lajes.

■ **Salgueiros** is another nice setting for swimming, as well as picnics and camping. It is located about 5 minutes further on the same road as Porto Martins.

■ **Salga Bay**, the location of the battle that pitted the locals against the Spanish armada that tried to invade the island in 1562, features a small natural swimming hole and nearby camping site.

■ **Bay of Silveira** is another well-known swimming area located on the west side of Mount Brazil in Angra.

■ **Negrilo**, the remains of an old 16th Century fort, is just off the main road in São Mateus — the town after Angra.

■ **Cinco Ribeiras** has a small sunbathing area about five minutes past Negrilo.

■ **Biscoitos** is another

popular swimming hole about 30 minutes northwest of the base. It features unusual volcanic formations resulting from ancient eruptions and a large natural swimming hole that's ideal for children.

■ **Quatro Ribeiras** and **Vila Nova** swimming areas are located in their respective towns. They're peaceful and offer a magnificent view of the ocean.

Born as sisters, m a

USAFE command chief, sister hold spec

Some heroes are born on the battlefield, while others come forward in times of need. One thing is for sure; they're almost always closer than you think.

Such is the case for two U.S. Air Forces in Europe members. Although they're 10 years apart in age, Master Sgt. Kim Fairchild, Office of Special Investigations Region 5 Headquarters chief of logistics at Ramstein AB, Germany, and Chief Master Sgt. Vickie Mauldin, Headquarters USAFE command chief master sergeant, consider themselves each other's hero — they're sisters with a special bond.

As with most siblings with a 10-year age gap, the two sisters didn't really know each other while growing up in the small town of Powellton, W. Virginia. Mauldin enlisted in the Air Force in 1974, when her sister, Kim, was only eight years old.

"Our dad was in the Navy, and we had an uncle in the Army, as well as an uncle in the Marine Corps during Vietnam," said the chief. "I remember listening to their stories; about what they went through and the camaraderie that they found in the service, and I was impressed with the self pride that they had from their experience in the military."

So, two days after her 18th birthday, Mauldin joined the Air Force with a guaranteed job in avionics. But, she kept in contact with her family back in W. Virginia, sharing her Air Force experiences. She didn't know it at the time, but through the years, those shared experiences influenced her younger sister.

"I learned most of my stuff about the military from her," said Fairchild, referring to her older sister. "The letters she would write from England, and all of these cool places that she was being stationed at. I would think I want to go there. I want to do that."

Fairchild knew that she couldn't afford to go to college, and didn't want to stagnate in a minimum wage job in her hometown. So, in 1984, when the Air Force recruiters came to her high school, there was no doubt about it — she wanted to join the

Air Force. She took the Air Force ASVABs (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery tests), and went delayed enlistment about a month after graduation. She entered the Air Force in January 1985.

"It wasn't until many years later, after she had been in the Air Force, that she told me she came into the Air Force because of me," said the chief, who unknowingly mentored her little sister. "She said the only reason that she is in the Air Force today is that she saw what I was doing, and how it was affecting my life, and she wanted to be like me. I think she even called me her hero, which really touched me."

The bond between the sisters strengthened shortly after Fairchild came in the Air Force, when they found themselves stationed near each other while assigned to different bases in Colorado.

"I was stationed at Lowry Air Force Base, Colo., when Kim came into the Air Force and went to technical training. Subsequently, she too was stationed in Colorado, first at Lowry AFB, then at Buckley Air Field, which is near by," said Mauldin, who was a technical sergeant at the time. "She was eight years old when I left home; to me she was just this little girl. But because we were fortunate enough to be stationed near one another, we got to know one another as sisters and as Air Force members."

As their Air Force careers progressed, so did their professional and personal relationship. Fairchild remained in Colorado until 1994. And, except for a short tour in Korea from 1991-1992, Mauldin was stationed there as well.

"We saw each other all the time," said Fairchild, who even lived with her sister for a while, prior to getting married. "She was always there for me. In fact, when it was time for me to reenlist for the first time, I was having second thoughts. I guess I was one of those young people who said I'm not staying in; I'm not doing this."

"But then I got to thinking about it and talking to my sister quite a bit about what I should do," Fairchild continued. "I didn't have a degree at the time, but just watching my sister as she progressed in her career and how quickly she made

rank; I started thinking I can do that. I can stay in and be happy."

So, Fairchild reenlisted and they continued to share military experiences while rising through the ranks.

The needs of the Air Force eventually distanced the two geographically, but not for long. Mauldin left Lowry AFB when she was reassigned to a base in Texas in 1994, and Fairchild made her permanent change of station move to Kapaun Air Station, Germany, in 1995.

But, the sisters continued to keep in close contact with one another, and soon found themselves stationed in close proximity again after Mauldin, who pinned on chief master sergeant July of 1995, was assigned to a NATO position at Geilenkirchen Air Base, Ge.

"The majority of my career, we've been stationed either on the same base as one another, or near one another," said Fairchild, who was assigned to Kapaun AS and Sembach AB before arriving at Ramstein in October of 1999. "It's been nice; she's been to all but one of my promotion 'pin ons', and she's been able to make it to all but one of my reenlistments. How many other people can say that about their sister, or any family member for that matter?"

More recently, Fairchild was also able to have her sister by her side during a very difficult time; she was diagnosed with having breast cancer Dec. 7, 2001. A very short and trying ten days later, she was in surgery for a modified radical mastectomy. The doctors at Landstuhl Medical Center here took out 19 lymph nodes; cancer was found in two of them. Mauldin was by her side, giving her inner strength and a shoulder to lean on.

"If it wasn't for her, I don't know that I could have gotten through chemotherapy," said Fairchild. "She's been there for me every step of the way. It doesn't matter if it's 3 p.m. or 3 a.m., she's always been there for me."

However, Mauldin believes her sister's courage would have carried her through the surgery and subsequent chemotherapy treatments.

"To have to go through something like she's been through is difficult anyway. But to do it without family around you would be even harder," said Mauldin. It was great to be able to be there for her. I went to all of her labs, plus when she had any concerns, because of my experience

and position, I felt I could reassure her that she was getting the best of treatment and what the doctors were telling her was right. She was able to lean on me not only as a sister, but also as a chief. With my professional knowledge, I was able to help her through everything from that aspect as well.

"But, I have faith that Kim would have made it through everything with flying colors, even if I hadn't been able to be near by for her," said Mauldin. "She has incredible strength, and I'm proud of her."

That sisterly pride was apparent in December 2002, when Mauldin was afforded the opportunity to tell her sister of her selection for promotion to master sergeant. Fairchild tested out of cycle because of her chemotherapy treatments.

"Her commander called me up and gave me the opportunity to be the one to tell her when she made master sergeant," said the elder sister. "Kim had had a very tough year with being diagnosed with breast cancer. With everything she had going on medically, her still taking the time to study to make the rank – I couldn't be more proud of her. And then, to have the opportunity to be able to be the one to tell her – it was awesome."

The two sisters are both getting ready to leave Germany and will no longer be stationed together, but one thing's for sure – their bond, both as sisters and Air Force professionals, will remain strong.

"In a sense of being my sister and a chief master sergeant in the Air Force, she's my hero," said Fairchild. "I look up to her personally and professionally. I wouldn't make any decision without asking her, in terms of my military career, and lately it's been just about every decision in my personal life. She's amazing; she's my hero."

Mauldin feels the same way about her "baby" sister.

"Since I came in the Air Force, and all of the rest of my career, Kim has been a part of it," said Mauldin. "Any success that I have achieved, she's right there along side me, cheering and encouraging me on."

"I'm very proud of my Air Force career, and I love being able to serve my country," she continued. "And to think that I have a baby sister who has done so well, and has worked so hard to achieve her rank; I'm proud to say I have a sister who's a master sergeant in the U. S. Air Force."

Heroes, mentors and friends – the sisters have a bond that can't be broken.
