## "Doomsday" plane visits Lajes

The U.S. Air Force E-4B known as the "Doomsday Plane" recently landed at Lajes Field.

The E-4B, which serves as the National Airborne Operations Center for the President and the Secretary of Defense, was here July 5 to 7 and again July 11 to 13. During its stay the plane always had one engine running in case there was a need for it to depart on short notice, and was highly guarded.

"The National Airborne Operations Center has a variety of missions, both operational and training, which require us to travel throughout the U.S. and around the world," said Airman 1st Class Adam Peterson, Tech Controller on the E-4B.

The E-4B is a militarized version of the Boeing 747-200 and provides a highly survivable command, control and communications center to direct U.S. forces, execute emergency war orders and coordinate actions by civil authorities.

Managed by Air Combat Command, the aircraft provides aircrew, maintenance, security and communications support in case of national emergency or destruction of ground command control centers.

The Boeing E-4B evolved from the E-4A, which had been in service since 1974. The B model was designed and brought into service in 1980. There are a total of 4 E-4Bs in the U.S. Air Force inventory and are assigned to Offutt Air Force Base, Neb.

The crew may include up to a 114 personnel, provided by ACC and the Joint Staff. The main deck is divided into six functional areas: a work area for the President and Secretary of Defense, a conference room, a briefing room, an operations team work area, a communications control area, and a technical control and rest area.

The aircraft has electromagnetic pulse protection and an electrical system designed to support advance electronics and a wide variety of new communications

equipment. Other improvements include nuclear and thermal effects shielding, and improved technical control facility, acoustic control and an upgraded air-conditioning system for cooling electrical components.

The E-4B has four engines; it's long range, high-altitude and can be refueled in flight. There is always at least one E-4B on alert at one of many selected bases throughout the world, to provide direct support to the President and Secretary of Defense

### Long-term care enrollment continues

RANDOLPH AIR FORCE BASE, Texas (AFPN) — Initial enrollment for long-term-care insurance has ended, but, people can still apply for care, according to Air Force Personnel Center officials here. People eligible include Air Force active-duty, selected Reserve, appropriated-fund civilian employees, retirees and qualified family members.

The insurance does not have an annual open season like many other health-care programs, officials said. The initial open enrollment season was held during 2002 to introduce the program, and officials have not been decided when there will be another open season.

The federal program is a benefit au-

thorized by Congress in September 2000 to help federal employees, including military, defray the rising costs of long-term care.

This can include home care, nursing home care or assisted-living facilities for people no longer able to perform normal daily activities because of chronic mental or physical conditions, officials said.

More information on the insurance program and how to enroll is available online at [www.ltcfeds.com](http://www.ltcfeds.com) — or by calling (800) 582-3337 or TDD (800) 843-3557. Offices are open 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. EDT weekdays and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturdays.

Employees may enroll at any time under one of two application processes:

— Full-underwriting application.

The majority of employees enrolling will use the full-underwriting application.

Abbreviated-underwriting application. The abbreviated-application process is limited to new spouses of currently employees within 60 days of marriage and newly hired and rehired employees within 60 days of date of hire.

It can also be used by temporary employees converting to permanent appointments within 60 days of appointment.

Employees returning from a nonpay status (including reservists called to active duty) may also enroll using the abbreviated process within 60 days of return to duty.

This applies as long as they were in a nonpay status more than three

# Common courtesy plummets in summer heat

AVIANO AIR BASE, Italy — I bet it is a scientific fact: When the temperature rises, common courtesy drops. There should be a name for it, like "heat madness."

I recently got a rude awakening about this phenomenon. I was disrespected by someone. Outwardly, I shrugged off the incident, but inside, I was hurt by it. So, like spilled soda on a hot afternoon, the negativity stuck to me. I found myself focusing on other people's rudeness and became a little cynical myself.

I reeled with anger when I heard someone here call an American Forces Network disc jockey a moron, and say, "I hate you. Get off the radio. If I were you, I would stab myself with a fork."

I felt sick to my stomach when I saw a woman belittle a food court worker because the worker mistakenly gave the woman ketchup instead of barbecue sauce.

I felt disgusted when my husband told me of a thrift shop customer who chastised a volunteer who wouldn't unlawfully bend the rules for her.

I wanted to scream with frustration when a manager from our base newspaper's publisher called to ask if there was anything I could do to stop Aviano people from threatening her workers when their ads didn't run in the paper. Never mind that the publisher

makes it clear those free ads run on a space-available basis only.

And what really bothered me was that it seemed people were being most cruel to those they viewed as "inferior": faceless lower-ranking airmen; food workers; full-time volunteers; Italian workers.

I wondered, is it the heat? Does excessive sunlight feed people's inner demons? In the spring, the base newspaper's inbox received about ten compliments a week; now, I was lucky to find two. Was it that nobody was doing anything nice around here, or was it that nobody was noticing?

I pondered this the other day as I walked into my office, barely noticing the cleaning lady walk past me. I see her every day, but I don't know her name. Her English is limited; my Italian is virtually non-existent. She cleans up the bathrooms, mops the floors and empties trash. Not a fun job, I'm sure. People walk over her freshly mopped floors and leave pools of water and trash on the bathroom counters every day. But, she does her job thoroughly and with a smile. She has a friendly greeting for everyone.

This particular morning was no exception.

"Ciao," she said to me. I returned the greeting. She pointed to my belly and asked, "Bambino?" I realized she was asking about my pregnancy, so I answered (with the little Italian I do know) that things were good. She gave me a

knowing smile and nodded her head, and we went our separate ways.

Not surprisingly, though, a smile had made its way on my face, too. And as the day continued, a weird thing happened. I zeroed in on the "flip" side.

I felt good when I saw an officer give up his booth seat so an enlisted mother could feed her three children comfortably in the crowded food court. I was pleased that the gate guards had genuine, friendly greetings for every driver coming on-base, despite a day spent standing in the heat in full gear.

I was amazed when I overheard a woman profusely thank a customer service representative for her help, even though the customer service rep wasn't able to locate the woman's order. The customer, though, appreciated the effort.

I even felt myself willing to stay late to help a co-worker create a going-away gift.

The cleaning lady did more than just say hello to me. Her simple gesture of kindness took my negative attitude and twisted it into the opposite direction to the point that I wanted to be a nicer person too. It wasn't about rank or status, job or environment. It was about one human reaching out and being kind to another.

There are still rude people out there. I still have the feeling that the heat can bring out the worst in people. But I think we can all beat the heat madness one courteous act at a time.

## Civilian career brief online

RANDOLPH AIR FORCE BASE, Texas (AFP) — Air Force civilians now have the ability to view their own career information online from any Internet-connected computer, according to Air Force Personnel Center officials here.

The virtual Civilian Career Brief offers information that might help in career planning like current position data, pay and benefits, appraisals and education, officials said.

"The biggest advantage of the virtual career brief is its convenience for

the customer," said David Davenport, chief of the Air Force re-engineering and development division, the office responsible for developing the program.

Employees will be able to see their information without having to visit the civilian personnel flight.

Besides position data, civilians can view information pertaining to:

- Certifications and language proficiencies.
- Appointments.
- Benefits.
- Overseas history.
- Special placement eligibility.
- Career program registration.
- Current job experience.
- Job history.
- Education level and history.
- Training history.

— Awards received.

— Appraisal summary.

People can access the vCCB through the AFPC secure Web site at <https://www.afpc.randolph.af.mil/afpcsecure/default.asp>.

New vCCB users will need to establish an account before using the service. Establishing an account takes only a few minutes, officials said.

Once on the AFPC secure Web site, select "Civ Career Brief" from the button menu.

"This new program isn't eliminating the career brief service from the CPF," said Davenport. "Employees can, however, save themselves valuable time over possibly having to wait in line."

## 'Should I stay or should I go?'

*Many expectant mothers find themselves facing tough decisions*

**H**aving a baby at Lajes can be challenging. As an active-duty member, I was given two options for delivering my baby.

I could deliver here on the island at the local hospital in Angra Do Heroismo or I could go on a medical temporary duty to the stork nest facility at Andrews AFB, Md., around my 34-week point to deliver.

I opted to stay here. Since this is my first child, I can't say what it's like having a baby in the states. But I can tell you about my experience here.

During my 34th week of pregnancy, I started going to Dr. Graca Almeida in Angra — a local obstetrician. Translators from the 65th Medical Group went with me to my appointments to make sure there wasn't a communication problem with the doctor.

I had heard rumors that made me a little apprehensive about delivering here. Fortunately it didn't sway my decision to stay because I delivered early and my husband would not have been with me for the birth of our daughter if had I gone to Andrews.

This brings me to one of the rumors I had heard. I heard that if I delivered here my husband wouldn't be allowed in the delivery room. I addressed the issue at my first appointment and the doctor said it was not a problem.

Don't be afraid to ask. More than likely you'll be allowed to have your spouse there at the birth if you choose.

Another rumor I heard was regarding pain relief during labor — or lack thereof. This is a true concern that may sway many people's decision. The best they

could offer for pain management was demurral. Delivering on island is truly 'natural childbirth.'

**T**hey had, for the hospital, only one anesthesiologist and they do not use him/her for deliveries, only for surgeries.

When I delivered I had an episiotomy. The sutures they used to sew me up were not the type that dissolve on their own. I had to make an appointment for eight days after I delivered to have them removed at the clinic on base.

If you have no complications you'll still spend at least two nights in the hospital.

The downfall to this is the visiting hours. The visiting hours are extremely limited. Patients are allowed two visitors at a time — twice a day. You only get 90 minutes a day for visitors and this includes your spouse.

There's a language barrier. It was pretty lonely. But the staff is nice and sign language usually works.

When one of the better English-

speaking nurses asked if I was going to breastfeed and I said yes she immediately put my baby next to me and tried to 'help.' Everyone from the cleaning ladies to the doctors will not hesitate to 'assist' you in breastfeeding. They get a little too personal sometimes.

The beds are the old crank style so you have to get out of bed to adjust the head and foot. If you want to sit up and breastfeed there's a chair right next to the door that leads out to the hall. That was a little uncomfortable.

**M**y roommate was permitted to smoke — but only in the bathroom. The bathroom is in the room.

I suggest taking a towel, robe and slippers or socks to keep your feet warm. You're not permitted to take a shower the day you deliver because they feel you are too weak and have lost too much blood.

Overall it was a good experience. Things are a little old fashioned, but they've been delivering babies on this island for centuries.

# Local parking rules interpreted for newcomers

Like other major cities in the country, Praia da Vitoria and Angra do Heroismo have parking meters installed in most of their streets.

The streets that have parking meters are identified with a big white traffic sign with a blue square and a white "P."

People who park in one of those streets need to purchase a parking meter receipt in one of the nearest parking meters that covers the period of time they expect to be parked.

To purchase the receipt one needs to drop the coins in the slot, press the green button and then wait for the receipt to appear in the opening below. The receipt should then be placed on top of the vehicle's dashboard so that it is visible.

Parking meter receipts need to be purchased only during the following days of the week and hours: Monday-Friday from 8 a.m.- 6 p.m. and Saturdays from 9 a.m. until noon.

The parking meters will accept euro coins ranging from five-euro cents to two-euro coins.


The meters will not provide change, so users need to make sure they have the right change.

People also should make sure the vehicle is not parked past the time limit they purchased the receipt for.

If someone needs to park extra time, they need to purchase another receipt and place it on top of the dashboard.

If a vehicle is found parked with an expired receipt the owner will get a ticket and be fined between 30 and 150 euros.

Individuals who find a parking ticket on the vehicle's windshield, either because of illegal parking or for not having a valid parking meter receipt, should contact the Security Forces' staff translator, Ms. São Santos, at 2-6177 for assistance.

- 2 hours – 1 euro
- 2h 30 mins – 1 euro, 25 cents
- 3 hours – 1 euro, 50 cents
- 3h 30 mins – 2 euros, 10 cents
- 4 hours – 2 euros, 40 cents

**Angra:**

- 30 mins – 25 cents
- 1 hour – 50 cents
- 1h 30 mins – 95 cents
- 2 hours – 1 euro, 25 cents
- 2h 30 mins – 1 euro, 55 cents
- 3 hours – 1 euro, 80 cents
- 3h 30 mins – 2 euros, 50 cents

# Identity theft lands cop in confinement

KIRTLAND AIR FORCE BASE, N.M. — An airman was discharged from the Air Force, given 14 months confinement and reduced to airman basic after being convicted of several identity-fraud-related crimes during a recent general court-martial here.

Senior Airman David A. Daniel, from the 377th Security Forces Squadron, was charged with larceny, forgery and intercepting mail from another airman. Charges were based on incidents dating back to September 2001,

according to Capt. Tiffany Dawson, from the staff judge advocate office at Kirtland.

Daniel obtained the driver's license and government travel card of a fellow security forces airman who was deployed in the aftermath of the 9-11 terrorist attacks, Dawson said.

With another security forces airman's help, Daniel obtained a post office mailbox to receive and intercept mail from his victim, Dawson said. The other airman was discharged for unrelated issues before the investigation. Daniel also used this mailbox to ob-

tain a credit card and convenience checks in the victim's name.

Daniel's purchases included a \$2,600 DVD player for his vehicle and a \$3,300 diamond engagement ring for his fiancée, according to Dawson.

Daniel pleaded guilty to 10 charges and elected to be tried and sentenced by a military judge alone.

Dawson said that during his guilty plea, Daniel admitted to stealing various luxury items from local merchants and placing the financial responsibility on a fellow cop while that airman was deployed overseas.

# The Best Stop

Lajes office helps flyers get respite from long jourmies

**F**or many who decide to peek out their British Airways window and look down, the stony bump surrounded by the sapphire blue of the Atlantic must look like just another chunk of brown-and-green rock. Shaped by volcanoes and discovered by Portuguese sailors 520 years before the first F-80 Shooting Star took flight, the island is, by most practical standards, remote.

Military fighter pilots who approach the island of Terceira on their way to touching down at Lajes Field have an entirely different view. For Eagle, Falcon, Warthog and other jet drivers, it is a necessary stop on the way to or coming from home from some arid, overheated chunk of runway airmen commonly call a "deployed location."

Some call Lajes a rest stop. Those who've experienced it and spread the word call it "The Best Stop."

That's because of the work done by the two people in the 65th Air Base Wing's CORONET Liaison Office, the only one of its kind Air Force wide. With phones always ringing, "In" boxes filled and information streaming in, Senior Master Sgt. Chris Vickmark and Staff Sgt. Jon Dowell always have their hands full. However, they always want to make the best impression.

"Pilots don't land here to do a mission. They are here to rest," said Vickmark of his transient aviator population. "We want

to let them know this is not just another rock in the middle of the ocean."

## Moving across the Atlantic

The office gets its title from the official name of the fighter movements across the Atlantic. A CORONET movement usually means fighters are flying between the United States and locations overseas. The office also welcomes fighters being delivered for sale to foreign countries as well as allied-nation flyers.

Although most fighter aircraft have unlimited range when refueled, most fighter pilots do not. Even flying nonstop at 500 mph would mean more than 12 hours of flying, including four or five hours of pre- and post-flight work. Stopping here means cutting that journey in half and making the trip home safe.

The location — about 900 miles from Europe and 1,500 miles from the United States — is not unfamiliar to sailors, flyers or heads of state. Christopher Columbus is

rumored to have stopped here in the 15th Century. The Azores were a stop for the first transatlantic flight in 1924. Presidents Eisenhower, Nixon, Carter and George W. Bush have all visited the island, Bush for the Atlantic Summit in March.

"Lajes Field" is a Portuguese Air Base 4. With its 10,800-foot runway, Lajes is where 2,000 members of the 65th Air Base Wing perform their mission of "enabling expeditionary forces." On the flightline, the heavies — tankers, cargo haulers and others — get service from the 729th Air Mobility Squadron, a tenant Air Mobility unit of the wing. For U.S. allied and other fighter jet jocks, getting behind the "Follow Me" truck, chocking the tires and

crashing in a warm bed all happens via the liaison office and the 65th Operations Support Squadron.

Vickmark likened the work to a hotel concierge. "We're there to provide them direct service; point them in the right direction for their needs," he said.

There is no Air Force specialty for this work. Capt Emille Bryant, 65th Operations Support Squadron transit alert maintenance officer, recognized the need for a squadron and wing representative to handle fighter pilots' needs. He initially assigned the task to TSgt Tommy Richardson, who established and cultivated the original CORONET liaison duties. These days, two new members carry on Richardson's tradition. Dowell is a C-130 crew chief and self-acclaimed "grease monkey" who admittedly likes working outside turning wrenches amid the smell of burning JP-8 fuel. Vickmark's specialty repairing satellite, wideband communications and telemetry systems is probably farther from this work than

Baghdad is from Los Angeles.

Both admit working in the office is a management and organizational endeavor. What's prized, according to wing vice commander Col. Kurt Klingenger, are other traits the two have.

"We rely on Chris for his organizational and management abilities. Jon provides us with much needed operational level abilities and insight. They make a great team and are providing exactly the kind of support we need to welcome our fighter crews," the colonel said.

Operation Iraqi Freedom brought higher stakes. Packages of fighters swarmed the island. Some flew toward the war, on their way to contributing to the more than 17,200 sorties Air Force Link said the Air Force has flown there since March 19. Some were coming home.

Whatever direction they were headed, it meant work at all hours for the office.
