## Wing overhauls network storage



The way data is organized on the Lajes computer network and the manner electronic records are stored will change forcing users to move or delete mountains of data stored on the old system by Sept. 30.

The use of an enterprise storage network means a number of changes for the more than 1,500 people who use the Lajes network according to Staff Sgt. George Aguilar, one of the NCOs managing the change for the 65th Communications Squadron. It will also make working with the network "easier" he said.

"All users are going to have all the information more organized, with easier access but at the same time with better security as far as accessibility, with more restricted privileges depending on the information users need," Aguilar said.

Use of the enterprise storage network is mandated by USAFE, Aguilar said. Instead of having several servers where units store



information and a litany of hard drives to manage, the network brings together both records management and data warehousing capabilities, Aguilar said.

"Management of information is the responsibility of the owners. The 65th Communications Squadron maintains the network," said 1st Lt. Joshlin Lewis, who spoke to squadron commanders about the change Tuesday.

Lewis said the most visible

change users will see is the creation of four new drives on their work PCs. The drives will have the letter designations O, R, S, and U.

According to Lewis, the 'O' drive will be used for records management. Each directory on the 'O' drive will contain four folders: a file cabinet, inbox, inactive files and electronic file plan. Here's how each is used:

■ File Cabinet. File cabinet fold-

ers on the 'O' drive will store official records. Records custodians will format the folder according to the file plan approved by base records management.

■ File Inbox. End-users should place official records in the inbox for filing by the records custodian.

■ Inactive Files. This folder contains records that have met their retention period according to Air Force instructions.

■ Electronic File Plan. This folder contains the base records manager-approved official file plan. The official file plan establishes the file folder architecture for the electronic record 'O' drive's file cabinet. Records custodians will store their approved file plan in this folder.

The 'S' drive transforms what users currently see as a shared organizational drive where common files are stored. Lewis said workgroup managers are currently ensuring people in their organizations can get access to the new drive. The 'R' drive will have a similar function.

### F-16 crashes; pilot safe

An F-16 Fighting Falcon pilot ejected safely before his aircraft crashed into the Yellow Sea about 56 miles southwest of Kunsan AB, Korea at 10:05 a.m. Sept. 9.

The pilot, Capt. Kevin Dydyk, was rescued by South Korean airmen in an HH-47 helicopter. Dydyk arrived here at noon and was reported in good condition at the 8th Medical Group clinic, officials said.

At the time of the accident, Dydyk, from the 35th Fighter Squadron, was on a training mission.

### Former chief of staff dies

9/10/2003 - WASHINGTON (AFP) — The Air Force's 11th chief of staff died Sept. 4 in McLean, Va.

Retired Gen. Charles A. Gabriel served as chief of staff from July 1982 to July 1986. He died of natural causes, according to officials at the Air Force Senior Leader Management Office in the Pentagon. He was 75.

Gabriel also served as the service's deputy chief of staff for operations, plans and readiness; the U.S. Air Forces in Europe commander and the commander of Allied Air Forces in Central Europe. He was the U.S. Forces Korea deputy commander and the deputy commander of United Nations Command in Seoul, South Korea. The general also was Tactical Air Command's deputy chief of staff for operations.

He is survived by his wife Dottie, their two children and grandchildren. Memorial services are scheduled for 1 p.m., Sept. 17 at Memorial Chapel, Fort Meyer, Va. Interment will follow at Arlington National Cemetery.

### Forces arrive air meet


POZNAN AIR BASE, Poland — U.S. pilots and maintainers arrived here Sept. 4 for an operation placing them with, and pitting them against, the world's foremost fighter aircraft.

NATO Air Meet 2003, a major recurring NATO exercise, kicks off live-flying exercises Sept. 5 and runs through Sept. 19

here and at Powidz Air Base, Poland.

The flying missions run an entire gamut of operations from tactical air, suppression of enemy air defenses and electronic warfare, said Capt. Derek O'Malley, 52nd Fighter Wing, 22nd Fighter Squadron 'A' Flight commander from Spangdahlem Air Base, Germany. O'Malley is also the squadron's operations officer at the meet.

"This is air-to-everything," O'Malley said, referring to even more missions, such as offensive and defensive counter air, air interdiction and air-to-air refueling. (USAFE News Service)

# E-mail story a hoax

## Officials say story detailing base realignments, closures is a fraud

WASHINGTON -- An e-mail hoax has been circulating through inboxes. The e-mail contains a spoofed Air Force Print News story about proposed base realignment and closure actions allegedly affecting all services.

Air Force public affairs officials

were alerted to the hoax by a military officers' association in California. The e-mail takes a legitimate Air Force Print News story titled "Air Force releases 2004 realignments," published July 23, and adds a fake list of Department of Defense installations for "closure or realignment."

Officials immediately dismissed the e-mail as a hoax, citing that the ongoing BRAC process is nowhere near complete.

They have not made any assessments, decisions or recommendations for closures and realignments to the BRAC Commission, according to Nelson Gibbs. He is the assistant secretary of the Air Force for installations, environment and logistics.

As part of the budget justification, defense officials must submit a number of reports and certifications to justify the need for the BRAC 2005 round, Gibbs said.

### 'Remain on the offensive'

SHANNON, Ireland -- At the heart of President Bush's speech to the country Sunday night is the idea that the war on terrorism is a war, and the United States must remain on the offensive, Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld said Sept. 8.

He spoke to reporters aboard his plane Monday as he returned from a trip to Iraq,

Afghanistan and Kuwait.

"We cannot defend every single place all the time," Rumsfeld said. "You have to try to defend, but you must reach out and go after the terrorists and ... find them where they are, and find their havens and disrupt their networks. And that takes all elements of national power."

In his Sept. 7 address, Bush requested an added \$87 billion to pay for military operations and reconstruction projects in the global war on terror. Defense officials said that \$75 billion is slated for Iraq and \$5 billion for Afghanistan. The money is requested as a supplemental appropriation to fiscal 2004 budget. Fiscal 2004 begins Oct. 1. (*DefenseLink*)

### MRE new items

Servicemembers in Iraq, Afghanistan and elsewhere will soon have several new MRE options to choose from for their deployed-dining pleasure.

The newest meals, ready-to-eat, feature three new entrée items: pot roast with vegetables, barbecue pork ribs and vegetable mani-



cotti. The menu also includes clam chowder, both peanut butter and crispy M&Ms, almond poppy seed pound cake, pumpkin pound cake, chocolate mint cookies and vanilla waffle-sandwich cookies.

The new entrée additions come at a cost, according to Defense Logistics Agency spokesman Jack Hooper.

"We are dropping three menu items that were found to be less popular than others," Hooper said. "We will continue working with military members who are consuming the products -- finding their likes and dislikes -- and adjusting as necessary."

Research into the popularity of menu items came from all branches of the military, said George Miller, director of Air Force Food Services. Air Force Services Agency officials are responsible for providing the Air Force input when decisions are being made on new MRE items. (*DefenseLink*)

"The 'S' drive resembles the shared drive many organizations had on their functional file," Aguilar said.

Meanwhile, users can use the 'U' drive for personal files storage, Lewis said. The drive will have a 30-megabyte limit.

Lewis said that once the enterprise storage network is up and running, the four new drives will be automatically added to a users PC. Aguilar said although for many, this will seem like a significant hill to climb, it's much easier than it looks.

"The majority of the people don't like changes. They make it look harder than what really is but it is definitely an easier and better way to handle information," the NCO said.

Lewis emphasized the need for all organizations to understand the significance of the change.

"All current organizational shared drives are going away by the end of next month," he said. "The information must be deleted or moved to the appropriate location on the new network drives."

# 86th AES deploys to Bulgaria

PLOVDIV, Bulgaria (USAFENS)—There are only four aeromedical evacuation squadrons in the U.S. Air Force with the capability of standing up an active mobile aeromedical staging facility and Ramstein has deployed one of them here at Exercise Cooperative Key 2003.

Eleven airmen from the 86th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron journeyed to Krumovo Air Base, Bulgaria for this year's exercise, putting their MASF skills to practice after months of preparation and two overnight simulated deployments at Ramstein.

"Some of us have prior real-world MASF experience in Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom, but most of us are experiencing this for the first time," said Capt. Lisa Ciesko, team chief for the MASF.

The acting patients for the exercise are primarily active duty Bulgarian military servicemembers and the airplanes performing the evacuations are being flown by the Lithuanians and Bulgarians.

The team also has support from

Moldova, Canada and U.S. Air Force reservists.

"It's challenging because not every country does things the same way we do," said Ciesko. "Exercises like these help us learn how to work together with foreign countries and develop a greater understanding."

The MASF is a forward-deployed basic medical facility housed in a small, three-section tent is used to care for military battlefield patients in the final stages before they are evacuated by an airplane to a larger hospital with more capabilities.

In the past, the facility used to require six C-130's to carry all the equipment and now it only requires one.

The process has been streamlined making it possible to fit two tents and all the required medical supplies and communication equipment into two humvees.

"We've come a long way," said Staff Sgt. Marc Nelson, medical technician for the MASF. "I was able to experience the new lighter, leaner package for the first time when I deployed with a MASF out of Pope Air Force Base, N.C., to Pakistan during Operation Enduring

Freedom."

According to Nelson, in Pakistan and right here for the exercise in Bulgaria, they were able to set up communication with air evacuation command and control and start accepting patients within 30 minutes of hitting the ground.

"I love this work," said Nelson. "It's getting into the nitty gritty and down in the dirt near the action. We get to work closely with the aircraft and load patients."

Capt. Marcus Brauer, health care administrator for the Canadian army, agreed with Nelson and said he thoroughly enjoyed working with the American team and plans on collecting information and taking ideas from his experience back to Canada.

The exercise Cooperative Key 2003 is based on a fictitious scenario in which NATO and partner nation air forces deploy approximately 1,700 military personnel and more than 70 aircraft in a multinational task force in support of humanitarian operations.

The goal of the exercise is to enhance the interoperability of NATO and its partners through cooperation and familiarization of the organization's procedures.
