A win/winter situation

USAFE launches safety campaign

RAMSTEIN AIR BASE, Germany – To reduce the potential for needless injuries and loss of life, U. S. Air Forces in Europe officials implemented a winter safety campaign from Nov. 27 through March 31, 2004.

The focus of the campaign is

to encourage Lajes members to plan their activities as if they were planning a mission, said Col. Scott A. Adams, USAFE Safety director.

"During the winter months, USAFE usually experiences an increase in adverse weather-related accidents and injuries – most of which are preventable," he said. "Risks are more easily assessed and managed in the planning stages of a mission or activity."

The slogan of this year's campaign, which was chosen to remind Lajes and USAFE personnel to avoid unnecessary risk and

actively manage the inherent risk in their activities, is "Risk – don't chance it – manage your life!"

While risk management is everyone's responsibility, commanders and supervisors should help their members assess winter activities, consider options and take action to eliminate or reduce the risks involved, Adams said.

"Integrating personal risk management into planning as early as possible provides our The winter safety campaign is about more than preventing mishaps, said Adams.

■ Holiday safety, new programs, more top the list

Command Chief Master Sgt. Doug Hodge remembered the night he almost got punched for trying to take the keys away from a friend who was drunk.

"At first, he wanted to fight me," said the 65th Air Base Wing's top enlisted person, "but then he calmed down and he got home safe. The next day he hugged me and thanked me for doing it."

Driving under the influence, new wing programs and concerns about the 650-plus enlisted people he serves were three of the issues Hodge discussed Wednesday.

With nine driving under the influence incidents since January, Hodge said there was no

rhyme or reason to the sudden rise in DUIs, with the most recent happening Nov. 28. However, he emphasized there are always alternatives.

"We're just at a peak," he said. "It's got nothing to do with morale. It befuddles me sometimes why people choose to drink and drive. There are so many alternatives in place like taxis, first sergeants, squadron programs and friends who can help."

On another front, Hodge said

the wing is embracing the 12 "Combat" and special-interest programs. In particular, he said, Project CHEER stood out. The program — Creating Hope, Energy, Enthusiasm, and Recreation — focuses on events for single and unaccompanied people here. It's drawn more than 320 people to a basketball tournament, an all-night movie marathon and more.

"These programs are some of the biggest things on our radar," he said. "All these programs are

New schools

FORT DIX, N.J. -- Two new centers of excellence and two Air Force schools have been created, Air Mobility Warfare Center officials announced Nov. 25.

The warfare center now will be home to the centers for agile-combat support and for air mobility as well as the U.S. Air Force Mobility Operations School and the U.S. Air Force Expeditionary Operations School. These schools join the existing U.S. Air Force Mobility Weapons School, Air Force Mobility Battlelab and Resources Directorate under the warfare center. The reorganization officially takes effect Dec. 1.

"This reorganization became necessary (because of) significant changes and growth to our mission," said Maj. Gen. Christopher

Kelly, the warfare center commander. "Our future lies in meeting the needs of Air Force mobility warfighters. By reorganizing, we are more efficient and better able to successfully complete our mission of improving Air Force mobility and combat-support capabilities."

The new centers bring together subject-matter experts focused on improving Air Force capabilities by developing or improving doctrine, training, organization, materiel, leadership, people and facilities. (by Tech. Sgt. Jeff Capenos, 421st Combat Training Squadron)

ROYAL AIR FORCE MILDENHALL, England -- A team of firefighters from here took first place amongst 13 Department

of Defense teams in the firefighter combat challenge relay event during the recently World Challenge XII held in Ottawa, Canada.

Performing what is known as "the toughest two minutes in sports," the Royal Air Force Mildenhall, England, team ran their hearts out in temperatures below freezing -- dressed in full bunker gear with an air pack -- along a demanding course. The first place standing in the DOD competition also put them fourth in the World.

The goal of the completion was to simulate the physical demands of firefighting by completing the course in a time totaling less than two minutes. The course included running up stairs five stories high with a hose pack over their shoulder, pulling up a 45-pound donut hose from the side of the stair block,

geared to making us and making our organizations stronger.

"We're moving in the right direction," he added. "We're embracing these as our own."

As Lajes puts its back into bettering quality of life, the chief said U.S. Forces Azores and the 65th Air Base Wing have "pin-point focus" on the mission. He said deployment capabilities are ramping up, including the command realigning the wing's deployment slots and buying new equipment.

That aside, aircrews fighting the War on Terrorism and many other operations across the globe are stopping here every day, he said.

"It's important our folks keep the mindset that Lajes matters,"

the chief said. "We still have squadrons stopping here all the time. A lot of people just don't see that."

Hodge said mission focus and deployment capability are also dovetailing nicely into every airman's fitness capability. The chief said he's doing 50 sit-ups, running 1.5 miles in about 14 minutes and 30 seconds. He admitted, however, that with push-ups, he can "do about 25 good ones."

"The change to the new fitness program is very positive," he said, "and it's about time."

The chief said he's also proud of the work done by the Top 3 and the Rising VI, lauding how each club is woven into the threads of activities across the wing.

Meanwhile, he championed his message of pride for Lajes' enlisted people ("They are the best.") as well as punching home an emphasis on holiday safety, doing what's right for the wing and the Air Force this holiday season.

"You can't worry about how your friend is going to react," he said, remembering his friend. "Just get them home safe. Get yourself home safe. We have a great team. Let's enjoy the holidays together."

New curriculum

MAXWELL AIR FORCE BASE, Ala. -- More than 500 majors attending Air Command and Staff College here are the first to experience a more robust and tougher curriculum.

The changes, directed by Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. John P. Jumper, prepare officers for operational career broadening and increase their knowledge of military strategy and expeditionary employment.

Besides revising more than 50 percent of the program, the college

staff initiated a modular school-year calendar to accommodate air and space expeditionary force rotations, said Col. Jim Forsyth, dean of education and curriculum.

Online voting

ROBINS AFB, Ga. -- Potentially hundreds of airmen serving worldwide may be eligible to vote online

in 2004 based on a major government initiative to simplify the absentee-ballot process.

The secure electronic registration and voting experiment program is part of the Federal Voting Assistance Program. Program organizers hope the experiment will encourage as many as 100,000 absentee voters, including reservists stationed worldwide, to register and vote in state primaries and the general election in 2004.

The initiative is designed to improve access to the polls for military people and American citizens overseas who have had difficulty receiving and returning ballots in the past because of mail transit time and their mobility. In 2000, a post-election survey found that almost 30 percent either did not receive a ballot at all or received it too late. (Air Force Print News)

Roche discusses Air Force future

AB, Germany -- Citing the ability to adapt as the greatest change for the Air Force, the secretary of the Air Force thanked airmen for their involvement in operations



Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom during a visit here Nov. 24.

Secretary of the Air Force Dr. James G. Roche met with hundreds of wing airmen to answer questions about the Air Force's future, from air and space expeditionary force rotations to the new uniforms. He also discussed specific technological strides the Air Force is taking.

"We've taken our technology and adapted it to the conflict we face," Roche said. "We're taking the brains of our airmen and putting them together with technology to create a new doctrine."

Roche explained the new doctrine helps ensure that no opponent can ever have a technical edge on the U.S. Air Force.

"We've had extraordinary weapon precision," Roche said. "The Joint Air-Surface Munition is the most accurate weapon we've ever developed in our history with a better than .9 probability of (hitting its target)."

In regard to AEF rotations, Roche said he hoped to work back to a normal schedule by March 2004.

"Our mobility force is the infrastructure of Iraq," Roche said. "When the Air Force leaves an (area) we always leave some people behind because they're so valuable." He also said the rotation was originally intended for stability.

When asked about the new blue Air Force utility uniform Roche said, "I can assure you if you're in a blue forest you will not be seen."

Roche, who retired as a captain after 23 years of Navy service, said the uniforms are still in development and are being designed to be more practical, especially for those working on the flightline.

"You've been tested in combat and done exceptionally well," he said. "Keep up the good work and happy holidays." (Air Force Print News)

Good training keeps you out of a porcelain pickle

My wife and I have started doing some things in our home we never saw mentioned in the "Parenting for Dummy's" handbook.

For starters we have begun keeping track of things coming out of our mouths that one would think never need be spoken. For instance, just last week I heard myself say, in a confident if not matter-of-fact voice "Jamison-put the pickle back into the toilet." I wonder now if those exact words have ever been spoken in that order before?

Most disconcerting? In that moment, I held no regard for why the pickle may have been toiletized -- or why I would actually want it returned. As they say, hindsight is 20-20. Unfortunately, we don't often have the benefit of knowing the outcome before having to respond to a given input.

Recently I had the opportunity to attend a conference at Ramstein AB, Germany. One of the guest speakers was the USAFE Command Chief, Chief Master Sgt. Gary Coleman.

In reference to himself and Gen. Robert H. "Doc" Foglesong, Chief Coleman said, "We are not five-year guys, we are five-minute guys."

The comment was indicative of the fact that the collective "we" must make decisions on the fly or suffer the consequences of inaction. We often don't have the good fortune of deliberating in depth before making the tough call.

Parenthood notwithstanding, as leaders regardless of rank we face chal-

lenges every day that were not in the "handbook." They may test us in ways we never expect and may not have been trained.

Without question, we are better able to make the right decision by knowing our business beforehand and knowing who the experts are in order to obtain accurate data and timely advice. This requires a realization that "I" may not be the expert. Our core values are a good starting point in the process of negotiating everyday matters of leadership but when all is said and done, sound judgment carries the day.

A wise old colonel once told me, "It ain't the right decision unless it's the right thing at the right time for the right reason." The point being if one of the three elements are missing the other two don't matter. I don't know that I took this advice to heart at the time but I have since come to appreciate it and apply it with some degree of success.

As a first sergeant, I see some silly stuff in a day, not far removed from the porcelain pickle incident or the hyper-extended Pampers pull-up catastrophe of 2003 -- but that's a story for a different day. Regardless of whether we're serving in a military or our civil capacity we are often faced with situations for which we have not been prepared. Allow me to coin my own phrase: "readiness is key to adlib."

Train appropriately, know your business and know your people before it becomes necessary, most often the right choice will reveal itself. I submit also, you are better able to negotiate uncharted waters if you have sound guiding principles that remain relatively unchanged. Consider your mentors, what guided them? Arguably most important, act in confidence and expect the occasional failure.

Your people are good. Trust they've got your six!


