The Automated Housing Referral Network (AHRN.com) is sponsored by the Department of Defense and is designed to improve the process of securing available housing for relocating military members and their families.

RECYCLING OF TONERS AND INK CARTRIDGES (CLARIFIED)

Used toners and ink cartridges must be returned to the businesses that sell them; however, there's an alternative on base to get rid of them. The Civil Engineering's Environmental Flight staff has volunteered to receive those toners and cartridges at no cost in Building T-575, and will forward them to the Portuguese International Medical Assistance organization (AMI) for posterior recycling. AMI makes a little profit for each used toner and cartridge. The proceeds will

be used for its humanitarian services worldwide. Also, personal items that people may have in their homes and would like to dispose, such as old electronic devices, i.e. televisions, computers, monitors, etc, can be taken to the BX warehouse, (Bldg. T-800), also for recycling. All items belonging to the government organizations still need to be processed through the proper offices, i.e. Comm Sq. DRMO, etc., like it has always been done. Please don't take government items to the BX warehouse for recycling as they must be cleared and turned in to the proper agencies. AFI 91-207 USAFE Sup:
3.5.2.1. (Added) In cases where separation of pedestrian and motor vehicle traffic is not feasible, military personnel in uniform must wear reflective accessories during periods of reduced visibility (hours of darkness, inclement weather, etc). Personnel in civilian attire are encouraged to wear light-colored clothing or reflective accessories. This requirement must be briefed during newcomers' orientation and addressed in the installation traffic code.
